

t PEC, we are committed to continually enhancing your experience with Smart Hub, our online portal, by introducing new features that make managing your energy needs more convenient and secure. Here are a few of the latest enhancements.

Outage Reporting: Report your power outage directly through your Smart Hub account, rather than calling. Once logged in, you will see Report Power Outage as a menu option on the left navigation. On the mobile app, click More on the lower right corner, then Contact Us, and Report Power Outage.

Outage and Restoral Notifications: Want to be notified when an outage or restoration occurs at your property? You may sign up to receive notifications via email or text message. Sign up is done through Smart Hub on the Manage Notifications menu option.

Submit an Inquiry: Submit address changes or billing questions through Smart Hub's Submit An Inquiry menu option.



Multi-Factor Authentication:

Multi-factor authentication (MFA) is a security process that requires you to provide two or more pieces of evidence to verify your identity when you log into an online account. The first piece of evidence is your password, the second is a code sent to your email or phone. Currently, MFA is optional for members, however, it is strongly recommended to provide an extra layer of security to your account.

As always, members can pay bills, schedule

payments, monitor usage, or sign up for automatic payments through Smart Hub. Don't have Smart Hub and want to sign up? Here's how:


- Go to the PEC website, www.PriceElectric.coop, and at the top of the screen, click Login to Smart Hub.
- A login page will open; below the sign-in button, click "Don't Have an Account? Register Now."
- Time to get set up! You will need your account number, last name, and email address.
- Continue to follow the prompts to set up your password and start experiencing the benefits of Smart Hub.


REBATE DEADLINE

Rebates must be submitted to PEC by December 29 to qualify for the 2025 incentive program. Qualified items purchased after this date will receive the 2026 rebate amount, if available. A full listing of the 2026 rebates will be posted in this magazine next month.



- Inspect windows and doors for leaks and seal them with caulk or weatherstripping.
- Optimize savings and convenience by using timers to turn holiday lights on and off.
- Light up your home for less and switch to energyefficient LED holiday lights. Bonus: PEC has a rebate available for LED lighting.
- Make handmade decorations, such as a wreath for your door, that do not use energy.
- Have your chimney and fireplace cleaned and inspected by a qualified professional and be sure to close the damper whenever the fireplace is not in use.
- Install a programmable Wi-Fi thermostat; it will save energy by automatically lowering temperatures at night and when you are away from home. Bonus: PEC has a rebate available for smart thermostats.

- Bake multiple batches of holiday cookies, pies, or casseroles all at once to maximize energy use.
- Turn down the thermostat when hosting holiday gatherings. Those extra bodies will provide free heat.
- After your holiday meal, scrape dishes instead of rinsing them, and only run full loads in the dishwasher. Modern dishwashers use less water and energy than handwashing.
- Cover your pots and pans; food will cook more efficiently. Match pots and pans to the size of the burner, and make sure the burners are clean.
- Try using a slow cooker or toaster oven for your side dishes, as they use less energy than a large stove or

Deck the Halls WITH THESE SAFETY TIPS

Consider purchasing LED lights, which use less energy and run cooler than traditional incandescent lights.

Never mount or support light strings in a way that might damage the cords' insulation.

Carefully inspect all electrical decorations before you use them. Cracked or damaged sockets and/or loose or exposed wires can cause serious shock or start a fire.

Always unplug electrical decorations before replacing bulbs or fuses.

Make sure that cords are not pinched in doors, windows, or under heavy furniture, which could damage the cord.

Turn off all indoor and outdoor electric decorations before leaving home or going to sleep.

RAISING AWARENESS AND HOPE: PEC'S BREAST CANCER AWARENESS CAMPAIGN





Key Insights at a Glance



- Breast cancer is the most common cancer diagnosed in American women.
- The 5-year survival rate in the United States of localized (early stage) breast cancer is 99%.
- Breast cancer typically has no symptoms when it is small and easily treated, which is why mammography screening is so important for early detection.
- Breast cancer death rates have dropped by 44% since 1989 because of advancements in treatment and earlier detection, resulting in approximately 517,900 averted deaths.

REMINDER OF CHANGES COMING TO BILL IN FEBRUARY

Starting with the January usage, which is the bill you will receive in February, you will see a new line item. This line item will be titled "Demand Charge." It will be listed at no charge but will display your home's actual peak demand for that billing period.

What is Demand?

Demand is the amount of electricity you use at any given moment. It is measured in kilowatts (kW) and represents the rate at which you consume electricity. For example, if you turn on multiple appliances at the same time, your demand will be higher compared to when fewer appliances are in use. Managing demand is important because it can influence the overall cost of providing electricity, especially during peak usage times.
