COOPERATIVE COMMUNICATION UPDATE

To improve communication with members, PEC implemented an automated outbound calling system called Multi-Channel Messenger-Integrated Voice Response (MCM-IVR). This calling system is currently being used for several event categories, such as planned outage communications, unplanned emergency outage communications, disconnect notices, and declined autopay, with more event options being added soon. Calls will come from PEC's local number, 715-339-2155, and each call will begin by notifying members that it is an important message from PEC. Some event categories are optional to receive calls, where members can opt-in to calls via the Manage Notifications screen in Smart Hub. Members can manage all cooperative notifications, whether via email, text, or call through Smart Hub.

It is critical PEC has a current phone number on file, so when MCM-IVR calls are sent to the phone number on file, you receive the notification regarding your account. DIRECTOR DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

How do I know if I am eligible to be a PEC director?

- You are a primary resident of the district you would serve.
- You are an active PEC member.
- You are not employed by or have a financial interest in a competing enterprise or business selling electric energy or supplies to PEC.
- You are not employed by PEC.

What are the responsibilities?


- Make decisions in the best interests of PEC.
- Approve general policies, budgets, capital credit retirements, etc.
- Attend monthly board meetings at PEC and occasionally travel to attend other meetings and events.

When does the board meet?

Typically, the board meets at 9:00 a.m. on the last Thursday of the month.

Is there compensation?

Yes, directors are paid per diem for each meeting plus a travel adder and mileage.



STEPS TO BECOMING A PEC DIRECTOR DIRECTOR NOMINATION/PETITION PROCESS


This year, board director seats are up for election in District 1 (Hill, Rib Lake, Spirit, Tomahawk), District 2 (Catawba, Georgetown, Hawkins, Kennan, Ogema, Westboro), and District 3 (Emery, Hackett, Knox, Lynne, Prentice, Somo, Wilson). Individuals elected will serve three-year terms.

The nomination petition process is as follows:

- 1) Candidates must first obtain an official nomination petition from PEC headquarters.
- 2) Candidates must obtain signatures of at least 15 members in the nominee's district.
- Petitions must be returned to Cooperative headquarters no less than 60 days before the annual meeting date. The deadline for nomination petitions is Friday, April 4, 2025.
- 4) Cooperative personnel will verify the member signatures and districts.
- A list of nominees will be posted at Cooperative headquarters no later than 25 days prior to the annual meeting date; this year, that date is Friday, May 9, 2025.
- 6) Candidates who have met the timeline and who have the appropriate number of valid signatures on the petition will be listed on the ballot of the annual meeting as prescribed in the Cooperative Bylaws.

Please review the duties, responsibilities and qualification requirements found at www.PriceElectric.coop. No nominations will be taken from the floor at the annual meeting if there is at least one nominee by petition who is able and willing to serve as director. If, for any reason, no nomination was timely made by petition, or if at the time of the annual meeting, all persons nominated are unable or unwilling to serve, then nominations may be made from the floor by any member who is a resident of the district for which the nomination is available.

The 2025 annual meeting will be Thursday, June 5 at Phillips High School.





2025 PEC SCHOLARSHIPS

Local High School Students

Student must attend one of the following high schools: Butternut, Chequamegon, Phillips, Prentice, or Rib Lake and contact their scholarship coordinator for application information. Applications should be submitted to the respective school within their submission deadline.

Scholarships are only available to seniors whose parents/guardians are active PEC members. Two \$1,000 scholarships are available at each school.

At-Large & Non-Traditional Students

At-large applicants are high school seniors who do not attend one of the local high schools listed above and whose parent/guardian is an active PEC member.

Non-traditional applicants must be active PEC members, 25 years of age or older and one of the following: did not continue or complete college after high school, attends college part-time, currently works fulltime, or has children or dependents other than a spouse.

Applications for at-large and non-traditional



scholarships can be found on the PEC website and should be submitted to PEC by April 26, 2025. Two \$1,000 scholarships are available in this category.
